January 1 Cattle Inventory in the Northwest Region Up 2 Percent from Last Year


January 1, 2024 all cattle inventory in Alaska was estimated at 19,000 head, up 6 percent from 2023. All cattle inventory in Idaho was estimated at 2.55 million head, up 2 percent from 2023. Inventory of all cattle in Oregon was 1.24 million head, up 2 percent from last year. In Washington, all cattle inventory totaled 1.17 million head, up 2 percent from January 1, 2023.

Nationally, January 1 all cattle inventory was estimated at 87.2 million head. This was down 2 percent from January 1, 2023. The 2023 calf crop, at the US level, was estimated at 33.6 million head, down 2 percent from 2022.


