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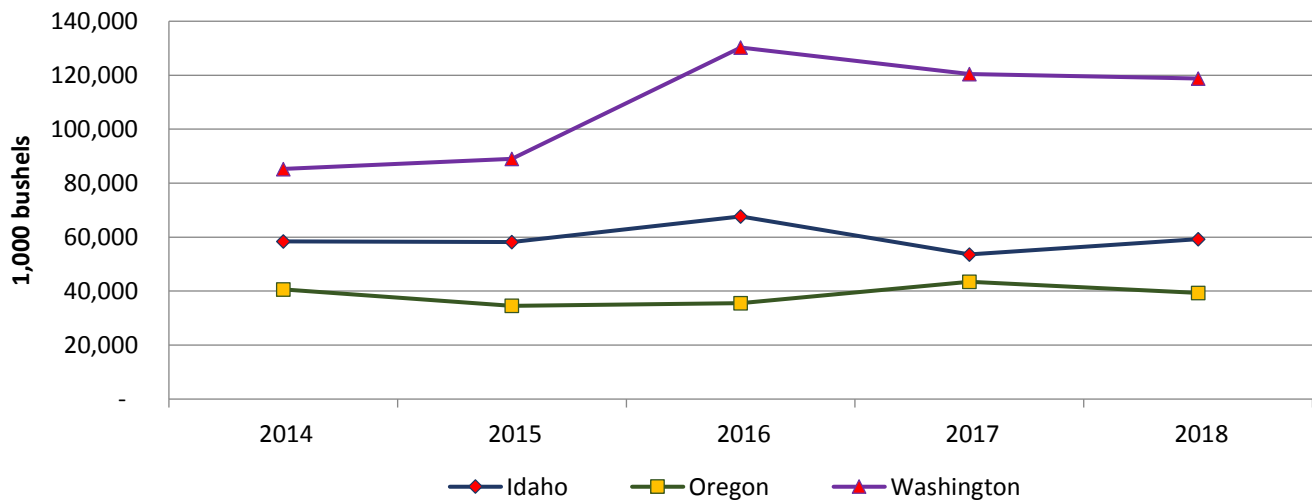

2014-2017 and Forecasted May 1, 2018**



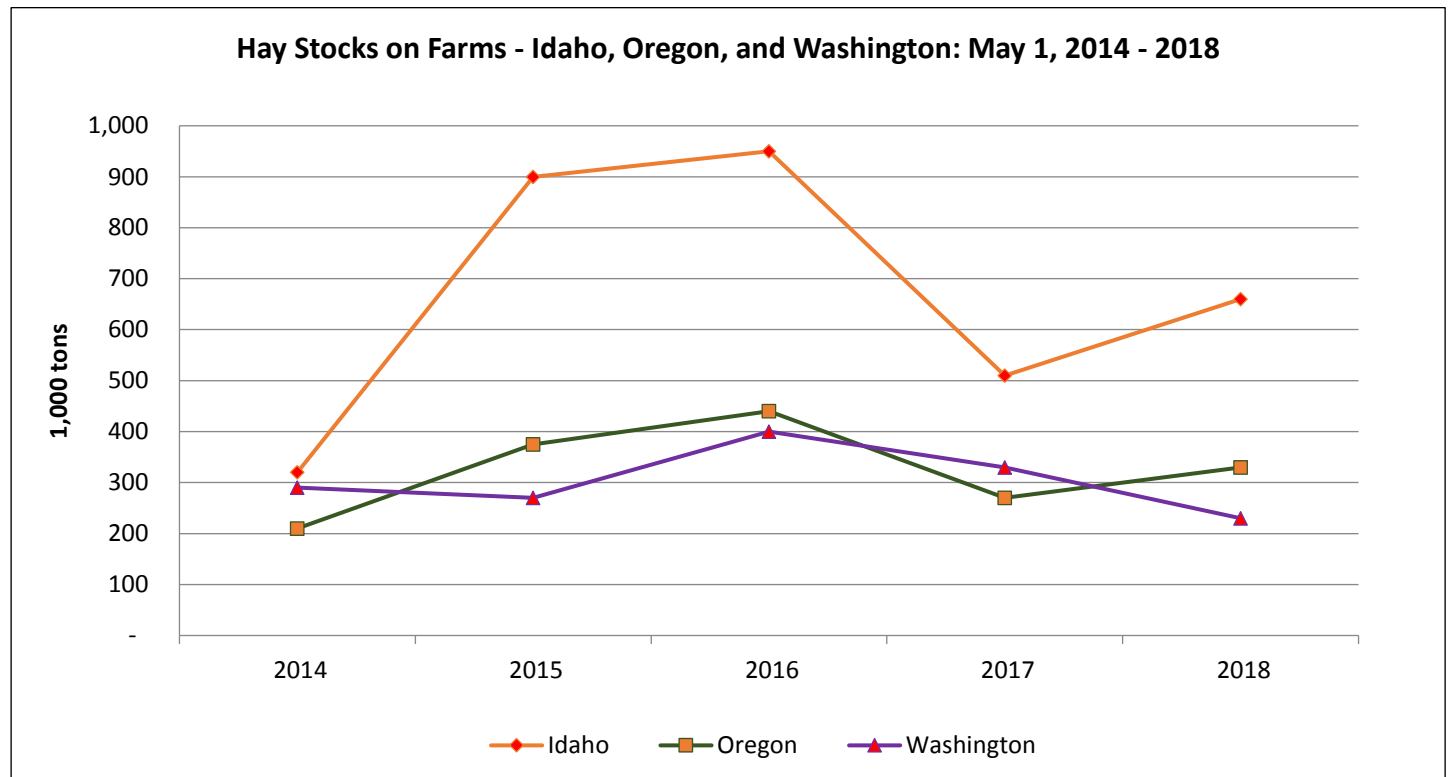
