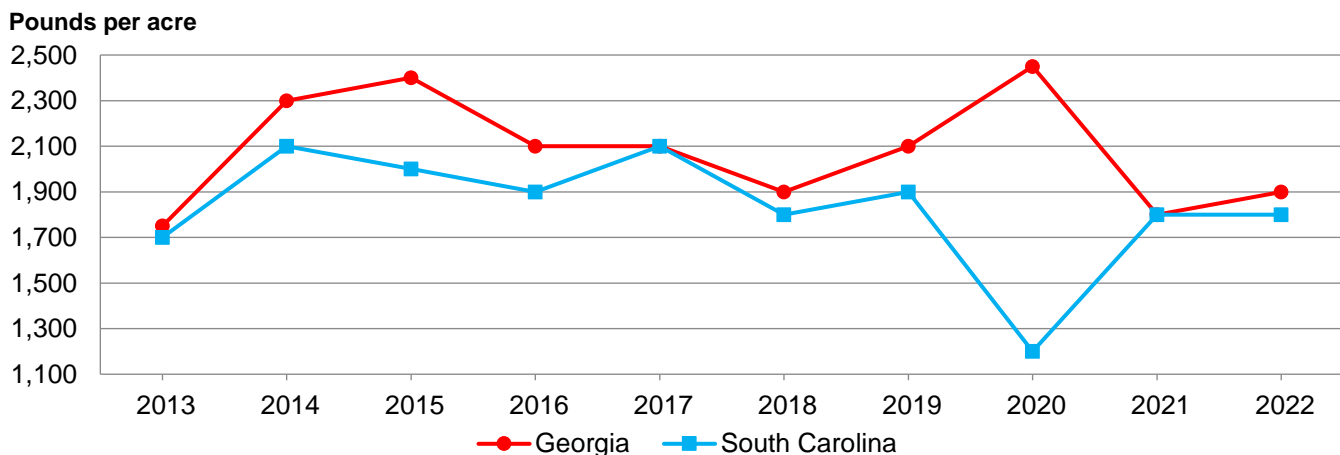
**US Winter Wheat Production Up 2 Percent from June Forecast**

Winter wheat production is forecast at 1.20 billion bushels, up 2 percent from the June 1 forecast but down 6 percent from 2021. As of July 1, the United States yield is forecast at 48.0 bushels per acre, down 0.2 bushel from last month and down 2.2 bushels from last year's average yield of 50.2 bushels per acre.

**Key findings for the Southern Region from July Crop Production**

United States all flue-cured tobacco production is forecast at 279 million pounds, down 11 percent from 2021. Production in Georgia is forecast at 15.2 million pounds, up 6 percent from last year. Production in South Carolina is forecast at 10.8 million pounds, down 21 percent from last year.
