


# FOREWORD

## SOUTH CAROLINA CROP SUMMARY

1994

**JANUARY:** January temperatures fluctuated from 12 degrees below to 7 degrees above normal, averaging 39.4 degrees. Although a cold front brought dangerous ice accumulations, no crop damage was reported. Precipitation totaled 3.18 inches, some of it as sleet and hail.

Small grain planting ended the first week, tobacco bed preparation began, and by the end of the month the beds were seeded and doing well.

**FEBRUARY:** Temperatures were below normal with light snow flurries, but warmed up to 9 degrees above normal, averaging 47.2 degrees. A total 3.5 inches of rain was received in February, most occurring at the beginning of the month.

Tobacco beds and small grains did well, and conditions allowed farmers to apply nitrogen and herbicides throughout the month. Land preparation began for spring plantings, and fescue started to green up about the middle of the month.

**MARCH:** The month began wet, slowing land preparations and chemical applications, but as the month progressed it got drier and ended with the soil moisture being 3 % very short, 30% short, and 64% adequate. Temperatures were above normal, averaging 55.2 degrees. Some highs were even in the 80's, until the last two days when frost and sub-freezing temperatures were reported.

Small grains remained in good condition. Corn, cantaloupe, and watermelon planting started and remained ahead of the five-year-average and far ahead of the previous year. Cucumbers and snapbeans were planted. Tobacco was transplanted to fields. All crops progressed as usual.

**APRIL:** Temperatures ranged from 1 degree below to 7 degrees above normal, averaging 63.6 degrees. Scattered frost occurred the first couple of days, with a little fruit and vegetable damage in some low-lying areas. The month began with mostly adequate soil

moisture, but only 2.2 inches of precipitation left the soil moisture rating at 14% very short, 55% short, and 31% adequate. The dry month allowed a lot of early planting and maturing. Corn planting was almost complete by the end of the month, which is earlier than usual. Cantaloupe and watermelon planting also proceeded well ahead of schedule and remained in fair to good condition, despite the dry weather. And as always with a dry April, small grains matured faster, with wheat being 85% headed out, compared with the previous year's 22% and the five-year-average of 58%. Cotton and peanut planting began toward the end of the month, also ahead of schedule, while snapbeans and tomato plantings proceeded about the same as previous years.

**MAY:** A few scattered showers and thunderstorms produced some much needed rain, but the State remained very dry and was considered in drought alert status. We received only 1.9 inches of rain in May, depleting the soil moisture from 23% very short, 68% short, and 9% adequate, to 41% very short, 57% short, and a mere 2% adequate. Temperatures ranged from 6 degrees below to 8 degrees above normal, averaging 66.1 degrees throughout the month.

Despite the dry weather, crops remained in fair to good condition, but rain was desperately needed. Corn started silking in May and all crops were nearly planted except soybeans and sorghum, each about 30% planted. Small grain and peach harvest began the third week. By the end of the month, wheat was 24% harvested, compared to the average 11%, and oats were 32% harvested, compared to the average 11%. The month ended with good small grain yields, and a thirsty State.

**JUNE:** June delivered just what the State needed, rain. We got a total of 5.7 inches throughout the month, and every drop of it was needed. After the 5.7 inches of rain, June ended with a soil moisture of 7% very short, 67% short, 24% adequate, and 2% surplus, which is the first surplus since the beginning of April. Temperatures averaged about 76.7 degrees, and stayed a couple of degrees above normal.

Corn was silking a little faster than usual, probably from the dry weather. As June began, cotton started squaring, the last of the peanuts were planted, and soybeans and sorghum were about 40% planted. Crops had been suffering, but the June rains kept the crop's condition fair to good. As the month rolled on, corn began to dough, tobacco topping started, and the watermelon harvest began. By the end of the month, tobacco was 58% topped. Corn was 86% silked, compared to the average of 52%, and 45% doughed. Cotton was fair to good, with 54% squaring and 10% setting bolls. Farmers stayed busy harvesting, completing almost all small grains, 27% of peaches, 40% of cantaloupes and watermelons, and 60% of tomatoes.

**JULY:** This month put crops right back on track. Precipitation totaled 9.1 inches, which put soil moisture back at a desirable level. Temperatures averaged 77.8 degrees, ranging from normal to 4 degrees above normal.

As the month of July started, so did the tobacco harvest. Most all the corn was silked, maturing at a normal pace, and by the end of the month harvesting began. Soybeans began to bloom and by August, were setting pods right on schedule. The cantaloupe and watermelon harvest was well underway, and a little more than 80% complete by the end of July. The hay and sorghum harvest was a little behind, but catching up. The peach and tobacco harvest was a little ahead of it's normal pace, and once again, all crops stayed in fair to good condition.

**AUGUST:** August began wet, with all crops doing well. Precipitation totaled 6.9 inches and temperatures stayed around normal, averaging 75.3 degrees.

The peach harvest progressed ahead of schedule throughout the month, while corn was being harvested at the usual pace. Soybeans developed faster than usual and the apple harvest began. The month ended with tobacco 83% and corn 44% harvested. Cotton bolls developed slower than usual, but it was still a good crop. Peanut harvest began the third week, a little behind schedule. Cantaloupes, watermelons, cucumbers, and peaches were virtually all harvested.

**SEPTEMBER:** It rained a total of 4.6 inches throughout September, keeping soil moisture mostly adequate but some short. Temperatures stayed a little above normal, averaging 69.8 degrees for the month.

Farmers began harvesting cotton, continued harvesting corn, apples, hay, peanuts, sorghum, and finished almost all of the tobacco harvest. Soybeans and cotton continued to stay in fair to good condition.

**OCTOBER:** We started out a little dry in October, but rains delivered a total of 6.4 inches, leaving the month with mostly adequate soil moisture. Temperatures averaged 60.8 degrees, ranging from 2 degrees below to 3 degrees above normal.

Small grain planting began and continued about the normal pace, with winter wheat being 20% planted. Almost all the corn and hay were harvested and all tobacco stalks were destroyed. The soybean harvest began and about half of the cotton and sorghum were complete.

**NOVEMBER:** Temperatures in November ranged from 1 degree below to 5 degrees above normal, averaging 56.1 degrees. We received about 5.7 inches of precipitation.

Farmers were busy harvesting. Cotton was 82% harvested, and soybeans were 51%. Over half of the oats and rye had been planted, and almost half of the wheat. All small grains that were planted emerged nicely and remained in good condition. All peanuts had been harvested by month's end.

**DECEMBER:** The year ended wet, with December receiving more than 3 inches of precipitation. Temperatures ranged from normal to 9 degrees above normal, averaging 48.8 degrees.

As the year was winding down, so was the cotton and sorghum harvest. The soybean harvest was going strong and on time. Sweetpotato harvest was still slower than usual, while small grains made good progress. Rains at the end of the month limited outdoor activities as well as soybean harvest.

## SOUTH CAROLINA FARM NUMBERS

The number of farms in **South Carolina** as of June 1, 1995 is estimated at 22,000, down 1,000 farms from the 1994 revised number of 23,000. Total land in farms for 1995 is 5.05 million acres, down 50,000 acres from 1994. The average size of farm in 1995 is 230 acres, up 8 acres from 1994.

The number of farms in the **United States** in 1995 is estimated at 2.07 million, up less than half a percent from 1994. Total land in farms is 972 million acres, virtually unchanged from last year. Average size of farms decreased from 471 acres in 1994 to 469 in 1995.





Off-Farm and On Farm**

Capacity of OFF-FARM commercial grain storage totaled 8.38 billion bushels in the United States on December 1, 1994, down 1 percent from December 1, 1993. Twenty-nine States and New England showed decreases from last year. Twelve States recorded increases in capacity and one was unchanged. The States showing the largest decreases were Texas, 44.8 million bushels; Nebraska, 20.2 million bushels; Washington 7.9 million bushels; and California, 7.1 million bushels. Iowa recorded the largest increase with 14.4 million bushels followed by Ohio with an 8.5 million bushel increase and North Dakota with an 8.2 million bushel increase.

Illinois continued to lead all States in off-farm storage capacity, followed by Iowa, Texas, Kansas, and Nebraska. The top five States accounted for 53 percent of the Nation's off-farm storage capacity on December 1, 1994. South Carolina ranks 31st among States reporting capacity, with 23.8 million bushels.

OFF-FARM grain storage facilities in the United States totaled 11,595 on December 1, 1994, 271 fewer than on December 1, 1993. States with the largest number of facilities are Illinois, 1,150; Kansas, 889; Texas, 857; Minnesota, 705; Iowa, 694, and Nebraska, 587. South Carolina ranks 27th with 107 facilities.

The United States ON-FARM grain storage capacity totaled 11.5 billion bushels on December 1 1994, down 1 percent from December 1, 1993. Iowa leads all States in on-farm storage capacity with 1.65 billion bushels followed by Minnesota with 1.30 billion bushels; Illinois, 1.22 billion bushels; Nebraska 1.10 billion bushels, and North Dakota at 760 million bushels. The top five States account for 52 percent of the Nation's on-farm grain storage capacity.

## LIVESTOCK REVIEW

**FARMS** in South Carolina were estimated at 23,000 for 1994, many of which included livestock as part of the farm operation. The total **LIVESTOCK and POULTRY INVENTORY VALUE** for 1994 was \$308,044,000 compared with \$332,187,000 in 1993 and \$331,654,000 in 1992.

There were 500,000 **CATTLE and CALVES** on South Carolina farms January 1, 1995, down 4 percent from January 1, 1994 and January 1, 1993. Included in this inventory were 7,000 cattle and calves on feed, down 30 percent from a year ago. The beef cow inventory at this same time totaled 242,000 head, down 5 percent from last year. The milk cow inventory at 28,000 was unchanged from January 1, 1994. The inventory value for all cattle and calves January 1, 1995 was \$277,500,000 down 3 percent from 1994. The average value was \$555.00 per head, up \$5.00 from 1994 but \$10.00 below 1993.

**HOGS and PIGS** on South Carolina farms December 1, 1994 totaled 350,000 head, 8 percent less than the 380,000 in 1993 and down 5 percent from the 370,000 in 1992. The inventory value was \$16,100,000 in 1994, down 44 percent from 1993's \$28,880,000. The value per head was \$46.00 in 1994, \$76.00 in 1993, and \$70.00 in 1992. South Carolina ranked 26th in the Nation in hog numbers with North Carolina 2nd, Georgia 14th, and Florida 30th.

**CHICKENS** in commercial and farm flocks in South Carolina as of December 1, 1994 totaled 6,280,000 birds, excluding broilers, down 2 percent from the previous December 1. The inventory value was \$14,444,000 in 1994, down 17 percent from 1993 but 21 percent above 1992. **BROILER PRODUCTION** grossed \$206,080,000 in 1994, up 21 percent from 1993's \$169,752,000, and 51 percent more than 1992's \$136,317,000. There were 588,800,000 pounds produced in 1994 receiving an average of 35.0 cents per pound liveweight equivalent.

## CATTLE

The South Carolina cattle industry had a total of 500,000 **CATTLE AND CALVES** as of January 1, 1995 with 14,000 cattle farms. There was a total of 242,000 beef cows while a decade ago 273,000 beef cows were on 18,000 farms.

The 1994 **CALF CROP** totaled 220,000 head, down 4 percent from the 230,000 calves born in 1993 and 2 percent below the 225,000 born in 1992. The **CALVING RATE** for these years measures the steady efficiency of South Carolina cattlemen with 81 percent for 1994 and 81 percent for 1993. These rates are conservative because some cows died or were slaughtered before

calving and the January 1 inventory does not include young heifers which had their first calf after that date.

**CATTLE and CALVES ON FEED** in South Carolina are animals being fed a ration of grain, silage, hay and/or protein supplement for slaughter market that are expected to produce a carcass that will grade select or better. It excludes cattle being "backgrounded only" for later sale as feeders or later placement in another feedlot. There were 7,000 cattle and calves on feed in South Carolina January 1, 1995, down 30 percent from the 10,000 head a year earlier.

## MILK PRODUCTION

There were an estimated 400 farms with one or more dairy cows in South Carolina during 1994 with an average 28,000 **MILK COWS** which produced 411 million **POUNDS OF MILK**. In 1993, the State had 450 farms with an average of 28,000 milk cows that produced 418 million pounds of milk. A decade ago in 1984, there were an estimated 2,000 farms with an average 47,000 milk cows that produced 541 million pounds of milk. South Carolina ranks 40th in the Nation for average milk cows. Newberry is the leading county with 5,400 milk cows, followed by Orangeburg, Anderson, and Saluda.

The 1994 **MILK PRODUCTION** was 2 percent less than 1993 and 1 percent below 1992. The 1994 annual average **MILK PER COW** at 14,679 pounds compares with 14,929 pounds in 1993 and 13,419 pounds in 1992. **FARM VALUE** of milk produced, which includes value of fluid milk and cream consumed in farm households, milk used for farm-churned butter, milk fed to calves, as well as marketings of milk and cream totaled \$61,530,000 in 1994 compared with \$60,759,000 in 1993, and \$62,081,000 in 1992. The **AVERAGE PRICE** of milk in 1994 was \$14.97 per cwt. compared with \$14.54 in 1993, and \$14.92 in 1992.

## HOGS AND PIGS

South Carolina had 2,500 **HOG FARMS** in 1994. The top five leading hog counties in terms of numbers and in order of importance were Orangeburg, Horry, Clarendon, Dillon, and Marion. Hog farms have decreased over the last 10 years from 14,000 in 1984. The top five leading counties in order for 1984 were Orangeburg, Horry, Sumter, Williamsburg, and Hampton.

The 1994 **PIG CROP** of 608,000 was 7 percent below 1993. There were 306,000 pigs saved in the spring of 1994 from 39,000 sows (7.8 per litter). The fall period

showed 302,000 pigs saved from 38,000 sows (7.9 pigs per litter).

**MARKETINGS**, which includes custom slaughter for use on farms where produced and outshipments, but excludes inter-farm sales within the State, during 1994 totaled 671,000 head in South Carolina. These marketings decreased 5 percent from the 1993 marketings of 709,000 head and were 1 percent less than the 1992 marketings of 676,000 head.

## EGG PRODUCTION

South Carolina **EGG PRODUCTION** in 1994 totaled 1,326 million eggs from an average 5,021,000 layers. This is up 3 percent from the 1,282 million eggs produced in 1993 but 8 percent below the 1,447 million produced in 1992.

The **NUMBER OF LAYERS** on hand during 1994 were 5,021,000, up 1 percent from the 4,975,000 on hand in 1993 but 10 percent less than 1992's 5,581,000

layers. The annual average **RATE OF LAY** per layer (including breeders) was 264 eggs in 1994 and 258 in 1993.

South Carolina **RANKED** 19th in the nation for egg production in 1994 with California 1st, Georgia 5th, North Carolina 9th, and Florida 12th. Within the State, Newberry County ranked 1st followed by Kershaw, Oconee, Darlington, and Saluda, counties.

## BROILER PRODUCTION

South Carolina broiler producers produced a record high of 147,200,000 broilers in 1994. This is 12 percent more than 1993 and 28 percent more than 1992. **POUNDS PRODUCED** totaled 588,800,000 in 1994, up 14 percent from 1993. The **AVERAGE PRICE** received for broilers in 1994 was 35.0 cents per pound liveweight equivalent, up 2.0 cent from 1993. **VALUE OF PRODUCTION**, which includes home consumption,

was \$206,080,000, up 21 percent from 1993's \$169,752,000.

Lexington, Aiken, Clarendon, Sumter, and Saluda are the leading broiler-producing counties in the State. South Carolina ranks 13th in the Nation with Arkansas holding the top and Georgia placing 2nd, Alabama 3rd, and North Carolina 4th, and Mississippi 5th.

## BEES AND HONEY

**SOUTH CAROLINA's honey production** during 1994 totaled 1,000,000 pounds, up 1 percent from the 1993 production of 990,000 pounds. The number of honey producing colonies was 10,000, down 1,000 colonies from 1993, with an average yield of 100 pounds per colony, up 10 pounds from 1993.

Honey stocks on hand December 15, 1994, totaled

150,000 pounds, 16 percent above the previous year. Value of production was set at \$820,000 compared with \$594,000 in 1993. Average price per pound, at 82 cents, was 22 cents above the previous year.

Honey production provides only a portion of the value of honey bees to agriculture. They also help to produce fruits and vegetables through pollination.

## CATFISH PRODUCTION

**SOUTH CAROLINA:** Catfish growers had an estimated 1,200 surface acres of water in commercial operations on July 1, 1995, up 9 percent from January 1, 1995. This ranks South Carolina 8th (tied with North Carolina) among the states published. The number of foodsize catfish (large, medium and small categories) on commercial operations on July 1 1995 totaled 3,070,000 compared to 1,523,000 on July 1, 1994. This level ranks South Carolina 5th in terms of number of foodsize catfish behind Mississippi, Alabama, Arkansas, and Louisiana. The number of commercial catfish

operations in South Carolina on July 1, 1995 was estimated at 36.

**UNITED STATES:** The water surface acres being used for catfish production in the 15 selected States totaled 158,840 acres, up 2 percent from the January 1, 1995 total of 155,420 acres. Commercial catfish operations had 184 million foodsize fish on hand July 1, 1995, down 1 percent from the July 1, 1994, total of 185 million. The total number of operations in the 15 selected States was 1,267, down 3 percent from the January 1, 1995 total of 1,300.

## U.S. MUSHROOMS AT RECORD HIGH

**UNITED STATES:** Total volume of mushrooms sales in the U.S. during the 1994-95 production year increased 4 percent over last year to a record high of 789 million pounds. Growers received an average of 96.2 cents per pound, up 1.80 cents per pound from last season. The number of growers increased from 358 last year to 371 this year due to a rise in the number producing specialty mushrooms.

**Agaricus** mushrooms production totaled 781 million pounds, up 4 percent from the previous season. Pennsylvania led all States in production with 355 million pounds, down fractionally from last growing season. Pennsylvania growers supplied 45 percent of all Agaricus mushrooms grown in the U.S. California ranked second in production with 135 million pounds. This production represented 17 percent of all Agaricus mushrooms grown in the U.S.

The value of the 1994-95 Agaricus crop totaled \$731 million, up 6 percent from last season. Growers received an average 93.6 cents per pound, up 2.00 cents per pound from a year earlier. Prices increased for both fresh and processing mushrooms. Prices averaged \$1.05 per pound for fresh mushrooms and 68.4 cents per pound for processing mushrooms. Fresh market sales accounted for 68 percent of the Agaricus crop while 32 percent

went to processors. When mushroom statistics began in 1967, fresh market sales accounted for 25 percent of the sales while processing made up 75 percent of the sales.

Volume of sales for commercially grown mushrooms (Shiitake, Oyster, and all other specialties) in 1994-95 decreased to 7.99 million pounds, down 5 percent from the 1993-94 production. The average price received by growers increased 13.0 cents per pound to \$3.54 per pound. Value of sales declined 2 percent from last year to \$28.3 million. A specialty grower is defined as one having at least 200 natural wood logs in production or a commercial indoor growing area.

**Shiitake** mushroom sales totaled 5.25 million pounds, down 6 percent from last year's sales. The average price that growers received was up 13.0 cents per pound. The value of the crop decreased 3 percent to \$20.1 million. Oyster mushroom sales are estimated at 1.71 million pounds, down 12 percent from last year. Prices were up 5 percent or 13.0 cents per pound. The value of sales was \$4.51 million or 7 percent lower than the 1993-94 crop.

**South Carolina** was one of the 26 states reporting. Individual state estimates are not published.


## CASH RECEIPTS

Preliminary cash receipts from farm marketings in South Carolina during 1994, including government payments, totaled \$1,430,359,000. The \$1.4 billion is 5 percent (\$71 million) above 1993 and 12 percent (\$149 million) above 1992. Commodity cash receipts of \$1,370,150,000 during 1994 were 9 percent above 1993 and 13 percent above 1992. Government payments for 1994 were 41 percent below 1993 and 17 percent below 1992. The number one commodity in terms of cash receipts during 1994 was **broilers**, accounting for 15 percent of the total.

**CROPS** cash receipts, at \$755 million, accounted for 55 percent of the total commodity cash receipts during 1994 compared with 52 percent in 1993 and 56 percent in 1992. Preliminary 1994 crops cash receipts increased \$99 million from 1993 and were \$83 million above 1992. **Tobacco, greenhouse and nursery, and cotton** were the top three crop commodities in 1994 in terms of cash receipts.

**LIVESTOCK AND LIVESTOCK PRODUCTS**, with cash receipts of \$615 million in 1994, accounting for 45 percent of the commodity total, increased 2 percent from 1993. **Broilers, cattle and calves, and eggs** were the top three commodities.


