SOUTH DAKOTA 2009 INCOME AND 2010 PRICES SUMMARY

INCOME

Cash receipts from farm marketings and government payments in 2009 totaled \$7.117 billion and were down 12 percent from 2008. Sales from all crops totaled \$4.499 billion, or 63 percent of the total. Income from crops was down 9 percent from 2008. Sales from all livestock and their related products accounted for \$2.362 billion, or 33 percent, of the total 2009 receipts. Income from livestock was down 12 percent from 2008. Government payments totaled \$256 million in 2009, down 36 percent from 2008, and were 4 percent of total receipts.

The largest income sources for 2009 were corn, cattle, soybeans, and wheat. Corn, down 9 percent from 2008, accounted for 27 percent of the total. Cattle, down 9 percent from 2008, accounted for 22 percent of the total. Income from soybeans increased 10 percent from 2008 and accounted for 20 percent of the total. Wheat receipts fell 31 percent and accounted for 11 percent of the total.

The 2009 net farm income totaled \$2.376 billion, down 21 percent from 2008.

PRICES


Preliminary 2010 marketing year average (MYA) crop prices were up from 2009 for most major South Dakota

crops. All corn MYA price was up 58 percent to \$5.10, \$1.87 above 2009. Soybean prices, with a MYA of \$11.20, an increase of \$2.02, were up 22 percent from the previous year. The all wheat MYA price was up 19 percent from 2009 to \$6.05, an increase of 98 cents per bushel. The all hay MYA price was down 3 percent to \$77.50 per ton. The all sunflower MYA price was up 44 percent from last year, to \$18.90 per cwt. Sorghum increased 64 percent to \$8.00 per cwt.

Marketing year average prices are computed by weighting monthly prices by the estimated monthly sales. Page 23 shows the crop marketing monthly percents for the major crops.

Annual 2010 livestock prices were up from 2009. The beef cattle price increased \$13.60 per cwt., to \$101.00. Steers and heifers price increased \$11.60, to \$102.00, and cows were up \$11.70, to \$59.10. Calves were up \$16.00, to \$127.00 per cwt. The all hog price of \$54.50 increased \$12.80 from 2009. Barrows and gilts increased 30 percent, to \$55.80, while sows increased 36 percent, to \$45.40. At \$146.00, the lamb price was up \$42.00, while the sheep price, at \$49.10, was up 73 percent from 2009.






