SOUTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. November 9, 2020 - For the week ending November 8, 2020, there were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 18% very short, 37% short, 44% adequate, and 1% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 22% very short, 40% short, 38% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Corn harvested was 92%, well ahead of 36% last year and 69% for the five-year average.

Winter wheat condition rated 2% very poor, 7% poor, 35% fair, 50% good, and 6% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 91%, near 94% both last year and average.

Sorghum harvested was 95%, well ahead of 59% last year, and ahead of 77% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 74%, well ahead of 42% last year, and ahead of 67% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 11% very poor, 26% poor, 44% fair, 19% good, and 0% excellent.
