SOUTH DAKOTA CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. October 23, 2023 - For the week ending October 22, 2023, there were 5.4 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 5% very short, 18% short, 70% adequate, and 7% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 9% very short, 25% short, 63% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Corn condition rated 5% very poor, 11% poor, 35% fair, 40% good, and 9% excellent. Corn harvested was 48%, behind 61% last year, but near 46% for the five-year average.

Soybeans harvested was 90%, near 91% last year, but ahead of 74% average.

Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 4% poor, 37% fair, 42% good, and 13% excellent. Winter wheat planted was 94%, near 95% both last year and average. Emerged was 69%, ahead of 61% last year, but near 71% average.

Sorghum harvested was 65%, near 67% last year, but ahead of 54% average.

Sunflower condition rated 2% very poor, 4% poor, 40% fair, 51% good, and 3% excellent. Sunflowers bracts turned brown was 88%. Harvested was 23%, behind 30% last year, and near 24% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 6% very poor, 6% poor, 29% fair, 47% good, and 12% excellent.
