SOUTH DAKOTA CROP VALUES

SIoux FALLS, SD, February 24, 2016 – The value of South Dakota’s 2015 **field and miscellaneous crops** is forecast at \$6.05 billion, according to the USDA’s National Agricultural Statistics Service. This is a 7 percent decrease from 2014.

The value of **corn** production is expected to total \$2.60 billion, down 1 percent from the previous marketing year. South Dakota’s corn price is projected to average \$3.25 per bushel, a decrease of \$0.09 from the last marketing year.

The value of **soybean** production is expected to total \$1.98 billion, down 8 percent from the previous marketing year. South Dakota’s soybean price is projected to average \$8.40 per bushel, a decrease of \$0.97 from the last marketing year.
