

This report contains results from the June 2021 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of June. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on July 23, 2021.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.85 million head on June 1, 2021, down 3 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 470 thousand head in commercial feedlots during May, down 17 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 430 thousand head during May, up 37 percent from 2020.

On June 1, there were 2.54 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down 2 percent from last year but up 2 percent from the May 1 total. May placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 435 thousand head, up 18 percent from the April total. Marketings were down 5 percent from last month at 385 thousand head.




Texas Cattle and Calves on Feed in 1.000+ Capacity Feedlots, by District



Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 275 thousand head on June 1, 2021, down 13 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 57 thousand head in commercial feedlots during May, down 12 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 56 thousand head during May, up 27 percent from 2020. Other disappearance during May totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
