

This report contains results from the December 2021 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of December. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on January 21, 2022.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.88 million head on December 1, 2021, down 1 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 445 thousand head in commercial feedlots during November, up 10 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 400 thousand head during November, unchanged from 2020.


On December 1, there were 2.55 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down slightly from last year but up slightly from the November 1 total. November placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 395 thousand head, down 14 percent from the October total. Marketings were up 7 percent from last month at 362 thousand head.



Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 300 thousand head on December 1, 2021, down 8 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 44 thousand head in commercial feedlots during November, down 15 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 43 thousand head during November, down 7 percent from 2020. Other disappearance during November totaled 1 thousand head, unchanged from a year ago.
