Oklahoma hatcheries set 7.59 million eggs in incubators during the week ending July 29, up slightly from the week prior and up 7 percent from the previous year.

The number of chicks placed for meat production during the week of July 29, was 3.89 million, down 19 percent from the previous week and down 26 percent from the previous year.

Texas hatcheries set 18.6 million eggs in incubators during the week ending July 29, up 1 percent from the week prior but down 1 percent from the previous vear.

The number of chicks placed for meat production during the week of July 29, was 14.8 million, up 2 percent from the previous week but down 2 percent from the previous year.
