

This report contains results from the September 2023 Cattle on Feed Survey collected during the first two weeks of September. Data provided by Oklahoma and Texas producers are the foundation of the estimates made for the Southern Plains region. We would like to thank all producers who responded to the survey. Results from the next monthly survey will be made available on October 20, 2023.

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Texas** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 2.74 million head on September 1, 2023, down 3 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 440 thousand head in commercial feedlots during August, up 2 percent from a year ago. Texas commercial feeders marketed 405 thousand head during August, down 10 percent from 2022.

On September 1, there were 2.43 million head of cattle and calves on feed in the Northern High Plains, 89 percent of the state's total. The number on feed across the area was down 3 percent from last year but up 1 percent from the August 1 total. August placements in the Northern High Plains totaled 394 thousand head, up 15 percent from the July total. Marketings were up 14 percent from last month at 367 thousand head.




Texas Cattle and Calves on Feed in 1.000+ Capacity Feedlots, by District



Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in **Oklahoma** feedlots with capacity of 1,000 head or more totaled 265 thousand head on September 1, 2023, down 5 percent from a year ago. Producers placed 43 thousand head in commercial feedlots during August, down 12 percent from a year ago. Oklahoma commercial feeders marketed 32 thousand head during August, down 24 percent from 2022. Other disappearance during August totaled 1 thousand head, down 1,000 head from a year ago.
