Texas Goat Inventory: The January 1, 2024 all goat inventory in Texas totaled 786 thousand head, 3 percent below last year. Meat and other goats accounted for 89 percent of all goat inventory with 700 thousand head. The Angora goat inventory increased 2 percent to 60 thousand head. The inventory of milk goats on January 1, 2024 totaled 26 thousand head, 13 percent above last year.

Texas Angora Goats and Mohair: The Angora goat inventory as of January 1, 2024 was 1 thousand head higher than the previous year. During 2023, 58 thousand goats and kids were clipped, 3 thousand head higher than the year before. Mohair production increased 14 thousand pounds to 329 thousand pounds. The average clip weight for 2023 was 5.7 pounds. The price per pound of mohair decreased 40 cents in 2023 to \$8.60. This brought the total value of the state's mohair production to 2.83 million dollars for 2023, 6 thousand dollars lower than 2022.

U.S. Highlights: All goat inventory in the United States on January 1, 2024 totaled 2.47 million head. Breeding goat inventory totaled 2.03 million head and market goats totaled 439 thousand head. On January 1, 2024, milk goats totaled 415 thousand head, Angora goats totaled 105 thousand head and meat and other goats totaled 1.95 million head. The 2023 kid crop was 1.52 million head for all goats.

Mohair production during 2023 totaled 505 thousand pounds. Goats and kids clipped, at 100 thousand head, were up 1 percent from 2022. Average weight per clip at 5.1 pounds, was unchanged from 2022. Value of mohair production was 3.21 million, 1 percent below 2022.

A random sample of U.S. producers was surveyed to provide data for these estimates. Survey procedures ensured that all sheep and goat producers, regardless of size, had a chance to be included in the survey. Large producers were sampled more heavily than small operations. About 26,000 operators were contacted during the first half of January by mail, telephone and face-to-face personal interview and 60 percent of the reports were usable. Regardless of when operators responded, they were asked to report inventories as of January 1.
