## CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION MONTH OF DECEMBER 2021

**AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY:** Moisture levels for topsoil were rated 89 percent adequate compared to 4 percent surplus and 67 percent adequate on the last weekly report at the end of November, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Subsoil moisture levels also improved compared to the previous report. Winter wheat condition rated fair to excellent increased from 72 percent on the previous report to 91 percent. The percentage of cattle and calves receiving supplemental feed is 81 percent compared to 55 percent on the previous report. Sheep and lambs receiving supplemental feed is 56 percent compared to 60 percent on the previous report. Beaverhead and Box Elder counties report producers are busy feeding cattle. As of January 3, 2022, snowpack in Utah was 128 percent measured as percent of median snowfall. Hay and roughage supplies were rated 55 percent very short, 32 percent short, and 13 percent adequate. Stock water supplies were rated 3 percent very short, 27 percent short, and 70 percent adequate.
