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Virginia Grape Acreage Increases in 2008

Virginia bearing acreage has increased from 2,400 acres in 2007 to 2,500 acres in 2008, a 4% increase over that time span. Total acres have increased from 2,790 acres in 2007 to 2,870 acres in 2008. This marks a 3% increase in total acres from 2007 to 2008.

Virginia's grape producers harvested 7,000 tons of commercial grapes in 2008, up 25% from the 5,600 tons produced in 2007. Production of the Vinifera varieties accounted for the majority of the overall production. Producers harvested a crop valued at \$10.4 million, receiving an average price of \$1,530 per ton.

Virginia ranked 7th nationally in commercial grape production and 7th for bearing acreage.
