Idaho Enters the Next Phase of Major Crop Harvests

Days suitable for fieldwork were 6.8. Pasture and range conditions were reported to be 9% very poor, 19% poor, 38% fair, 31% good, and 3% excellent. Low temperatures were reported at 26 degrees Fahrenheit in the south central region and a high temperature of 96 degrees Fahrenheit in the southwest region with a statewide temperature differential of 2 degrees below normal to 7 degrees above normal. The cereal harvests were largely completed across the state. Winter wheat planting picked up as fall approached. Southeastern Idaho had warm, dry weather as the wheat and barley harvests wrapped up. South central Idaho corn silage harvest began. Lots of beans were cut, pulled, and in the windrow. Southeastern corn harvest for grain started. The statewide potato crop was in the early periods of harvest or prepared to begin the following week. Sugarbeet harvest was just getting underway. Dry conditions slightly worsened pastures during the reporting week, but cattle were on the range and looked good. Overall Idaho crops remained in good condition as the remaining crops entered their harvest periods.

Warm Dry Conditions Benefited Harvest in Washington

There were 7.0 days suitable for work. Pasture conditions were reported as 39% very poor, 33% poor, 16% fair and 12% good. Scattered showers continued throughout western Washington. Recent precipitation and cooler weather benefited livestock. Many producers reported they had to feed livestock because of short pastures. The received precipitation had not impacted conditions, but pond water for flood harvest of cranberry bogs increased. Early apple harvest continued. Lots of ripe pumpkins were laying in fields. Final cutting for grass showed good growth from timely rains and warm weather. Temperatures continued to be cooler than normal in central Washington. Recent showers caused some re-seeding of winter wheat, while some producers have yet to seed 2016 winter wheat crop due to poor moisture conditions. Some livestock producers continued to supplement their livestock due to lack of forage and spring and lake water. There were reports of crop loss due to lack of water. No reports of cattle loss were reported due to weather conditions. Apple harvest was underway with Golden and Red Delicious, Honeycrisp, and Granny Smith varieties being picked throughout Yakima County. Peach and nectarine harvest was winding down. Field corn, hops, tomato, winter squashes (including pumpkins), peppers, and melons were being harvested. Warm temperatures were reported in east central Washington. Winter wheat seeding continued while a large portion of producers had to reseed because of crusting conditions caused by precipitation. Soil moisture was reported to be below normal in some areas of the district. Warm temperatures were reported in southeast Washington. Producers were starting to do fall field work and fall seeding.

Crop Harvest Continued with Little Rain Reported in Oregon

There were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork. Pasture and range conditions were reported to be 26% very poor, 40% poor, 28% fair, and 6% good. In the northwestern region, grass and corn silage crops continued to be sporadically harvested. Generally cooler weather helped reduce the stress on vegetables, remaining small fruit, and pastures. Rains in the past two weeks improved conditions for growing crops. Water rights were being cut off. Rickreall Creek had all rights cut off that were newer than 1940, and the Luckiamute River was cut back to newer than 1970. One nursery and a number of small farmers were cut off from water. The fourth cutting of alfalfa was baled. Grass for seed was planted and soil was prepared for sweet corn rotation. Sweet corn harvest continued, but was near an early end. Fruit was at the markets. Nurseries irrigated shrubs and arborvitae and prepared for shrub dig. Livestock and pastures were holding up well with the heat and drought. Low temperature was 43 degrees with a high of 84.6 degrees. Some wind was reported but no rain. In the northcentral region, the week was cool and wet early, changing to warm dry conditions for the remainder of the week. Winter pear harvest was underway throughout the Hood River Valley. At least two grass fires were reported in Sherman County as dry conditions continued. Weed and stubble management was underway for Sherman and Wasco County cereals. Oregon State University variety test results were studied to decide on variety selections for the 2016 crop. A short rain on Friday afternoon and evening resulted in .20 inches of rain. Drought conditions continued. In the northeastern region, potato harvest picked up and corn silage cutting was in full swing. Union County reported temperatures climbing back into the upper 80's over the past week after receiving 0.5 to 1.0 inches of rain and cooler temperatures the previous week. In the southeastern region, Lake County reported extreme drought conditions. Cattle were shipped to feedlots. In the southwestern region, almost all of Coos County and the northern portion of Curry County remained at D3 drought levels with basically no precipitation. Water levels in rivers and creeks remained at or below late fall levels. Cattle were shipped to feedlots earlier than normal due to lack of feed and water. Pastures were irrigated where possible. Fruit crops on the coast looked good. The low temperatures were reported from 49.98 degrees in Brookings to 51.59 degrees in Bandon. High temperatures were 80 degrees and 70.8 degrees respectively. Douglas County reported that hot temperatures returned, putting additional stress on low river levels used for irrigation. Fruit, vegetable, and nursery crops continued to need irrigation. Ornamental nursery crops suffered leaf scorch. Wine grape harvest was underway several weeks ahead of last year and nearly a month ahead of the long term average. Rain would be needed for seeding fall crops.
