Apples

Based on August 1, 2017 conditions, Idaho apple production is forecast at 51.0 million pounds, down 8 percent from last year. Production is forecast at 175 million pounds in Oregon, down 10 percent from 2016. At 64 percent of the U.S. apple production, Washington still ranks number one in apple production. Washington apple production is forecast at 6.70 billion pounds, down 8 percent from last year's production.

Grapes

Total grape production in Oregon is forecast to be 74.0 thousand tons, up 10% from 2016. Washington total grape production is forecast at 460 thousand tons, down 6 percent from last year. Of the 460 thousand tons in Washington, 200 thousand tons are forecast for juice grapes, down 8 percent from 2016. Washington wine grapes are forecast at 260 thousand tons, down 4 percent from last year. Washington is the second largest grape producer in the nation at 6 percent of national production.

Peaches

Idaho peach production is forecast at 6.00 thousand tons, down 23 percent from 2016. Washington peach production, at 14.0 thousand tons, is up 12 percent from last year. Washington peach production is forecast as the fourth largest in the U.S.

Pears

Total Oregon pear production, at 237 thousand tons, is up 10 percent from last year. Oregon is forecast to lead the nation in other pear production at 180 thousand tons, up 12 percent from 2016. Oregon Bartlett pear production is forecast at 57.0 thousand tons, up 6 percent from last year. Total Washington pear production, at 280 thousand tons, is down 20 percent from 2016. Of that total, 120 thousand tons are for Bartlett pears, down 19 percent from last year, and 160 thousand tons are for other pears, down 20 percent from 2016.

Cranberries

Cranberry production in Oregon is forecast at 480 thousand barrels, up 20 percent from 2016. Oregon ranks fourth in the nation for cranberry production. Washington cranberry production, at 180 thousand barrels, is up 3 percent from last year.
