### **Apples**

Based on August 1, 2020 conditions, Oregon apple production is forecast at 180 million pounds, up 20 percent from 2019. At 69 percent of the U.S. apple production, Washington still ranks number one in apple production. Washington apple production is forecast at 7.40 billion pounds, down 3 percent from last year's production.

### **Cranberries**

Cranberry production in Oregon is forecast at 530,000 barrels, down 5 percent from 2019. Oregon ranks fourth in the nation for forecasted cranberry production.

### **Grapes**

Washington total grape production is forecast at 430,000 tons, up 10 percent from last year. Of the 430,000 tons in Washington, 170,000 tons are forecast for juice grapes, down 11 percent from 2019. Washington wine grapes are forecast at 260,000 tons, up 29 percent from last year. Washington is the second largest grape producer in the nation at 6 percent of national production.

### **Peaches**

Washington peach production, at 12,500 tons, is up 12 percent from last year. Washington peach production is forecast as the fifth largest in the U.S.

### **Pears**

Total Oregon pear production, forecast at 250,000 tons, is up 6 percent from last year. Total Washington pear production, at 390,000 tons, is up 18 percent from 2019.
