## Hay Stocks in Northwest Region Down 16 Percent from 2103

Hay stocks on farms on May 1, 2014 totaled 320,000 tons in Idaho, down 44 percent from a year ago. May 1 stocks represent 6.4 percent of 2013 production. Disappearance from December 1, 2013 was 2.03 million tons. On-farm hay stocks in Oregon totaled 210,000 tons, down 9 percent from 2013. May 1 stocks are 6.6 percent of 2013 production. Disappearance from December 1, 2013 totaled 1.49 million tons. Washington on-farm hay stocks totaled 290,000 tons up 61 percent from last year. May 1 stocks represent 9.0 percent of 2013 production. Disappearance from December 1, 2013 was 910,000 tons. Hay stocks stored on United States farms totaled 19.2 million tons, up 35 percent from a year ago. May 1 stocks are 14.1 percent of 2013 production. Disappearance from December 1, 2013 totaled 70.1 million tons.
