

RED MEAT PRODUCTION

Commercial red meat production during September 2025 totaled 1,000,000 pounds. This was down 17 percent from September 2024.

Commercial red meat production in West Virginia during October 2025 totaled 1.0 million pounds. This was down 33 percent from October 2024. Commercial red meat production is the carcass weight after slaughter including beef, veal, pork, lamb and mutton. Individual commodity production is total live weight of commercial slaughter.


Commercial cattle slaughter totaled 1,312,000 pounds live weight, down 37 percent from October 2024. Cattle slaughter totaled 1,100 head, down 900 head from the previous year. The average live weight was up 129 pounds from the previous year, at 1,177 pounds. **Commercial hog slaughter** totaled 203,000 pounds live weight, down 34 percent from last year. Hog slaughter totaled 700 head, down 400 head from the previous year. The average live weight was down 7 pounds from the previous year, at 284 pounds.
