### Annual Farm Finances –

Comparing your farm

USDA is gathering 2019 data from farm operations like yours. The data collected will inform farmers, ranchers, USDA, and the public on the financial condition, production practices, and resource use of America's farms and ranches. Results are useful in comparing your farm with others and for understanding the overall well-being of U.S. agriculture.

The Agricultural Resource Management Survey (ARMS) is conducted by USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) and Economic Research Service (ERS) along with your state department of agriculture. Data gathered in 2019 will be released in the annual *Farm Production Expenditures* report on July 31, 2020.



### **ARMS Snapshot: 2018 Commercial Farm Operations**

A commercial farm is defined as any farm earning \$350,000 in more in gross cash farm income, and all non-family farms.


# Gross cash farm income = income from the sale of crop and livestock products, plus farm program payments and other farm-related income.
