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## USDA MEASURES FRUIT and VEGETABLE CROPS

[Concord, New Hampshire] The New England Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) is prepared to collect data for fresh market fruit and vegetable prices and yields. Throughout October and November, over 2,400 fruit and vegetable growers in New England will be contacted by phone for their assistance in this region wide effort. "The information from this survey probably directly impacts New England fruit and vegetable growers more than any other survey we do," said Gary Keough, director of the New England Field Office of NASS. "USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) relies on the average yields and prices to administer farm programs. The results are extremely valuable for growers to assist in making marketing decisions, for Cooperative Extension to provide needed outreach and education, and for State Departments of Agriculture to aid growers."

NASS will ask growers in Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont to provide yield and price information on tree fruits, berries, melons, and over 25 different fresh market vegetables. Connecticut growers will be contacted for apple, peach, pear, and sweet corn data only. As with all NASS surveys, information provided by respondents is confidential by law. NASS safeguards the confidentiality of all responses and publishes only state and national level data, ensuring that no individual producer or operation can be identified. National fruit and vegetable statistics for the 2008 crop will be available in January 2009 on the Internet at [www.nass.usda.gov](http://www.nass.usda.gov) within minutes of the scheduled release time. Exact publication dates and times will be available in October 2008. The ***New England Fruits and Vegetables 2008 Crop*** publication will be available in March 2009 on the Internet at [www.nass.usda.gov/nh](http://www.nass.usda.gov/nh) with yield and price estimates for 35 commodities.
