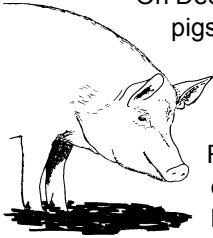


HOGS and PIGS

In New England there was a total of 1,550 operations with one or more hogs on hand during 2001, down 50 farms from 2000.

On December 1, 2001, the inventory of all hogs and pigs on farms totaled 36,500 head, 10 percent lower than the previous year. When compared to a year earlier, inventories decreased in Connecticut, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Vermont by 500 head each; decreased in Massachusetts by 2,000 head, and remained the same in Maine. There was a decrease of four percent in the

number of breeding hogs from the previous year throughout the region, and market hog inventories decreased 11 percent from 2000 levels. The December 1 inventory value of \$3.2 million was down nine percent from 2000. The total pig crop in New England decreased six percent from 2000, with 63,300 pigs born in 2001. Marketings totaled 71,500 head during 2001, up seven percent from the previous year. A one-dollar increase in the average price per 100 pounds from 2000 to 2001, coupled with increased marketings, resulted in a 12 percent increase in gross income to \$7.5 million in 2001.
